Homage

"Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising and have come to pay him homage."

Christmas, as it has come to be celebrated in our time, is a blended holiday—a blend of secular and religious traditions from many cultures. But even its biblical origins are an interesting mix, drawn from three gospels and the books of several Old Testament prophets. Some historical confusion arises as a result. For instance, as any good biblical commentary or scholar will tell you, the wise men that came to see the infant Jesus probably arrived several months after his birth. Still, in our nativity scenes they show up side-by-side with the shepherds on the very night Christ was born.

No doubt this bothers some purists, but it does not trouble me. Nit picking of this sort misses the point. Whenever they actually arrived, they came in the Christmas spirit. That is to say, they came to be in the presence of the newborn king and to "pay him homage." They came to honor him as the one chosen by God to lead God's people.

To pay homage is to show respect or deference, to demonstrate our esteem, or (as some versions put it) to worship. It is to give due recognition and honor to someone who is worthy of it. It is an act that is both humbling and exhilarating, because in the process of paying homage we touch holiness. We are put in touch with God's glory.

My prayer this Advent season is that we will all emulate the wise men and find ways to "pay homage" to the one whose birth we celebrate. And may our encounter with God's glory fill us with faith and hope that lasts all year.


Second Annual MCOB Neighborhood Caroling (approx. 1:30 PM)

Advent meanings

During Advent, which begins this year on December 3, many churches and families use wreaths to symbolize watchfulness and increasing joy as Christmas approaches. Colors for the candles vary, with some traditions using blue (for hope or creation) and others preferring purple (for royalty, humility or penitence).

The four candles that each represent a week in Advent also signify hope, peace, joy and love. (The third candle is often pink.) In the center is the white Christ candle, representing Jesus as the light of the world. That candle is lit on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.

The round, green Advent wreath has special meaning of its own. It symbolizes eternal life and the unending love of God, who sent his only Son to earth to die in our place.
