

I'm about to reveal a "deep truth," so be sure you are sitting down before reading further. Here it is: Worrying is easy. Trusting God is considerably harder. Ok, so maybe this wasn't all that deep, but it certainly rings true for many of us.

It is easy to worry and fret about all sorts of things: our financial situation, political violence, climate change, our health, parenting, difficult relationships, microplastics—the list goes on! Our easy access to information often heightens our anxiety as we are regularly bombarded with bad news and new things to be concerned about.

> Yet regardless of what is happening in our world or in our own personal lives, God does not want us to be consumed by worry. Instead, God wants us to live with a sense of confidence and hope, trusting in God's goodness despite the storms of life. But how do we do that? And what does it even mean to put our trust in God?

During the last three Sundays in July, I'm planning a short sermon series

that considers these questions from a variety of different angles. We'll see how Israel's manna miracle, Hezekiah's actions under pressure, and Jesus' words provide insight into what it means to trust God. My hope is that this series will encourage and equip you to "trust in the Lord with all your heart" so that you might have the strength you need to face life's challenges with courage and grace.
