

Our church now has a new sign in the front yard. The sign was made possible by an endowment received from Shirley Zimmerman a few years ago. The idea for the sign came during a

leadership meeting in January of 2024. The subject was discussed of being able to better announce the events and special services our church holds throughout the year, and better invite the community to our fellowship. The Stewards were commissioned to research and bring to the leadership team, the different options available. After many months of research and unfortunately delay due to reasons undisclosed here, the Stewards proposed the purchase of a LED Digital sign from the Stewart Sign Company out of Florida. The sign was ordered the 3rd week of July and arrived the 1st week of August.

Then came the real work. It was decided that we had in house, the skills necessary to install the sign. Once installation plans arrived from Stewart Sign Company, the planning started to execute the necessary steps to complete the installation. Then Mother Nature decided to bring the rain we needed in mid-July. This deluge of rain made the ground too soft for the heavy equipment that would be used to do the installation. When the weather cleared, and the ground dried, work started and was completed in a short amount of time.

Through the dedication and support of Keith Thornton, Harvey Cassel, Ron Kiehl, Keith Hawk and Stan Goodwin, the job was completed, and the sign went live on October 11th.

You see today after a long-committed effort by many in our congregation and many blessings from the Lord, a communication avenue, that we hope will bring many to know that the Mechanicsburg Church of the Brethren is here and welcomes all, regardless of who they are to come, share our fellowship, worship with us and celebrate the love of our Living Savior the Lord Jesus Christ.


