

Worship Theme: Though God does not cause our suffering, God can work through it to strengthen our character and to transform us.

How powerful are you? "Faster than a speeding bullet. More powerful than a locomotive. Able to leap tall buildings in a single bound." Probably not. But chances are, you are far more powerful than you realize.

This year, we are focusing on the theme of power in our Lenten study series as we are making our way through Kathy Escobar's book *Turning Over Tables: A Lenten Call for Disrupting Power*. According to Escobar, "It's crucial that we recognize we all have power. Power, in and of itself, isn't bad or negative; it is what we choose to do with that power that matters" (p. 4).

Most of us are far more powerful than we realize. As people of faith, we are called to use our power in constructive, non-coercive ways, to build others up rather than tearing them down. We can use our power positively to advance God's kingdom of peace and justice in the world. And we can use our power to meet the needs of others and to advocate for the most vulnerable members of society.

Though our superpowers may not manifest themselves in the form of great strength or dramatic acts, they sneak out in acts of love and service. Let us remember that we are empowered by the very same Spirit who empowered Jesus. May that encourage us to live godly lives and to bear witness to the good news of Jesus this Easter season.




Lunch & Learn Fellowship

Attention Children and Youth of all ages!


The Christian Ed committee is bringing back the **Bible-A-Thon** event! This is a chance to crack open your Bible and use it to test your knowledge!







