

March 2: Service of Licensing "Called to Be Table Waiters"

Worship Theme: Many believe that being called to the ministry is solely about a profession. But the biblical accounts talk as though it is much more about servant leadership.

Scripture: Matthew 20:20-28; Acts 6:1-7

March 9: "Personal Reflections on Following Jesus" - Eric Seibert

Worship Theme: After highlighting key ideas from the recent "Following Jesus" sermon series, a few people from the congregation will share what following Jesus means to them.

Scripture: Psalm 77:11-15; Philippians 1:3-11

March 16: One Great Hour of Sharing

"Meeting the Needs of "the Least of These" - Eric Seibert

Worship Theme: The Church of the Brethren has designated this Sunday as the One Great Hour of Sharing which focuses on meeting the needs of people through such things as disaster relief and development efforts.

Scripture: Deuteronomy 10:17-21; Matthew 25:31-40

March 23: Why Do People Suffer? (1 of 3) - Eric Seibert

Worship Theme: We will evaluate various ways people explain human suffering—and the role they think God plays in it—to gain a better understanding of why people suffer.

Scripture: Deuteronomy 28:1-6, 15-19; Matthew 5:43-45; Luke 13:1-5

March 30: How Can We Help People Who Are Suffering? (2 of 3)
- Eric Seibert

Worship Theme: This message considers how Job's "friends" respond to his suffering and offers some practical do's and don'ts when helping people who are hurting.

Scripture: Job 1:13-19; 2:1-7, 11-13; 2 Corinthians 1:3-11

Then he [Jesus] began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes and be killed and after three days rise again.

Mark 8:31, NRSVue

Most of us do not like to suffer. I sure don't! We typically avoid suffering like the plague. After all, it's no fun to hurt. But pain and suffering are unavoidable realities of life. We can do our best to minimize and mitigate suffering, but we cannot fully escape it. Everyone suffers from time to time, some more intensely than others, some more frequently than others, but suffering is common to us all.

In the season of Lent, we remember the suffering of Jesus, who was crucified for his faithfulness to God. Jesus knew that his public ministry and his unswerving obedience to God would run afoul of the religious leaders of his day. He told his disciples that he "must undergo great suffering," and he also told would-be followers that they should be prepared for much the same (see Mark 8:34).

Human suffering inevitably raises profound theological and practical questions. During Lent, we will reflect on some of these through a three-part sermon series on human suffering. We will consider 1) why people suffer, 2) how to help those who suffer, and 3) what good can come out of our suffering.

All this will lead us toward Easter and the hope of new life, reminding us that pain and suffering are not the final word. Thanks be to God!

Changes to Worship Service Livestreaming beginning March 16TH

Sunday morning March 16th the Church Tech Team will continue streaming services through YouTube, but will no longer stream through Zoom. Below are some questions you may have about this change.

Question: Why is the team making this change?

Answer: Congregants have told us the video and audio clarity are better through YouTube, compared to Zoom. Providing one stream will also simplify the technology needs Sunday mornings.

Question: I always use Zoom, and have never viewed the service through YouTube. Can someone help me?

Answer: Yes, members of the Tech Team will be reaching out before March 16th to assist those who usually join through Zoom to make the transition. You can also contact the church office to arrange for assistance.

You may also notice that the email sent each Friday with the bulletin attached has links for both Zoom and YouTube. You can try joining through YouTube before March 16th to confirm it works for you.

Question: I have always enjoyed joining the Zoom session before church starts and getting the chance to talk to other participants. Will I be able to do that with YouTube LiveStream?

Answer: No, unfortunately YouTube only allows you to view the service. There is no mechanism in YouTube to correspond with other viewers.

The Tech Team realizes the importance of fellowship for those who cannot attend worship in person. March 16th we will be launching a weekly "Zoom Virtual Pre-Service Coffee Chat" from 10:15 to 10:25 AM. During this time, you can converse with other Zoom participants.

At 10:25 AM participants will be urged to hop over to the YouTube livestream.

Question: Will anything else be changing?

Answer: Yes, to provide a more seamless livestream we are moving the passing of the microphone for announcements to coincide with greeting one another after the first hymn. If you would like to make an announcement, please fill out a green announcement card prior to the service and give it to someone in the Tech Area. A microphone will be brought to you after the greeting time. Announcements should relate to church activities rather than be prayer requests.

Question: What about prayer requests?

Answer: Prayer requests should continue to be offered via the yellow cards in the pew racks.

Question: Why must prayer requests be written on the yellow cards rather than offered on the microphone?

Answer: Since microphone announcements will now be part of the livestream, they will be available to anyone in the world. It is a recommended online safety practice for churches to limit personally identifying information. That is why Pastor Eric will only use first names in his pastoral prayer. If you would like to provide more details about your prayer request to the congregation, please do so through the prayer chain.




