

#### Palm Sunday


**Worship Theme:** Jesus generally traveled on foot, and sometimes by boat, but when he was preparing to enter Jerusalem for the last time he borrowed a donkey. Why?

Scripture Text: Luke 19:28-40

#### March 31: "Empty is Everything" - Jim Benedict Easter

**Worship Theme:** Because the tomb was empty, our hearts are filled with hope and our future is full of possibilities.

Scripture Text: Mark 18:1-8



When is the right time to plant potatoes? According to my father, it is Good Friday. According to some of the old-timers down in Maryland, it is St. Patrick's Day. According to the Old Farmer's Almanac, the right time is 2-4 weeks before the last frost. So when is the right time? Who knows?

But this much we do know: according to the Apostle Paul, in his letter to the Christians at Rome, "at *the right time* Christ died for the ungodly." Still, we may ask, what time was that and what makes it the "right" time? For the answers to those questions, we may read on in the 5<sup>th</sup> chapter of Romans. Just two verses later we find, "But God proves his love for us in that *while we still were sinners* Christ died for us."

Franciscan priest and writer Richard Rohr explains what makes this the *right* time: "*Most of us were taught that God would love us if and when we change. In fact, God loves you so that you can change. What empowers change, what makes you desirous of change, is the inner experience of love. This alone becomes the engine of positive change."* 

If God had waited to send Jesus until we had behaved well enough to deserve it, we would still be waiting. But when God sent Jesus to die for us while we were still sinners – when we didn't deserve it – it became clear that God's motivation was love. Love had to come first. That is what made it the *right* time. And that love is what makes us able to change, to become better by loving others and by learning to love ourselves in the right way.

As we make our way through the last weeks of Lent this coming month, let us take time each day to remember God's love for us and others, and give thanks.


## **Vacation Bible School Coordinator Needed**
