

SEPTEMBER WORSHIP THEMES

A sermon series: "Ten Weeks with the Ten Commandments" - Pastor Eric Seibert

September 7: "Put God First" (1 of 10)

Worship Theme: If our devotion to God, the one true God, is total and complete, it effectively sidelines all other "gods" clamoring for our attention.

Scripture: Exodus 20:1-3; Deuteronomy 6:4-9

September 14: "Don't Make Images of God" (2 of 10)

Worship Theme: Any attempt to represent God in concrete, tangible ways always results in a poor substitute for the reality of God, a God who is big, beautiful, and irreducible.

Scripture: Exodus 20:4-6: Isaiah 44:9-20

September 21: "Don't Take God's Name in Vain" (3 of 10) **Worship Theme:** Although this commandment is often simply understood as a prohibition against using words like "God" or "Jesus" inappropriately (e.g., as swear words), a closer look reveals there is much more to the third commandment than bad language.

Scripture: Exodus 20:7; Amos 2:6-8; Ezekiel 36:16-23

September 28: "Observe the Sabbath" (4 of 10)

Worship Theme: In our increasingly busy and frantically paced world, this commandment is perhaps more needed today than ever, reminding us that rest and renewal are blessed by God.

Scripture: Exodus 20:8-11; Deuteronomy 5:12-15

When God finished speaking with Moses on Mount Sinai, he gave him the two tablets of the covenant, tablets of stone, written with the finger of God.

-Exodus 31:18, NRSVue

This is a test. Without looking in your Bible, how many of the Ten Commandments can you name—in order? Take a moment and give it a try. Write them down if you like. Okay, now open your Bible and read Exodus 20:1-17. How well did you do?

Even if you could not name all of them from memory, I assume most of you have some familiarity with these "Ten Words" as they are called in Hebrew. They are at the heart of ancient Israel's covenant with God and are undoubtedly the most well-known laws in the entire Old Testament. But what do they mean and how do they apply to us today?

This September, I'll begin a sermon series titled "Ten Weeks with the Ten Commandments." By focusing on just one commandment each week, we'll be able to take a closer look at these important laws. While considerable time and energy has been invested in the debate over whether the Ten Commandments should be displayed in public places, my interest in this series is to gain a better understanding of what they involve and to challenge us to live ever more faithfully in light of them.

As we make our way through the commandments over the next couple months, I hope you will be encouraged by the enormous amount of wisdom they have to offer us in our ongoing efforts to be rightly related to God and to others. Thanks for joining in!

At **True North VBS**, which was held from August 4th – August 7th, we had an average attendance of 10 participants each evening. What a spectacular turn out!



We will begin Lunch and Learn with a Virtual Field Trip. Through Zoom, The Continental Congress at the Colonial Courthouse in York, PA will come to life.



The York County History Center offers this virtual field trip. There will be Historians walking us through this event.








The **Church Book Club** will meet on Monday, September 29th at 7 p.m. on Zoom.

In addition, there are many hundreds more who are supportive with their finances and donate items to be sold as well as providing funds to accomplish the purpose of raising funds for disaster relief work.




